The prime purpose of FoSC is to raise the money needed to upgrade and maintain the aging fleet of SHS racing shells, so we are very pleased to announce two very good pieces of news with this regard.

In January 2004 the girls' team took delivery of a brand new Quantum Racing shell. The purchase was made possible by generous alumni donations made on behalf of Forrest ‘Clink’ Miner, alum of ‘41, donations

from the athletic boosters, and the extensive fundraising efforts of the boys' and girls' teams. The shell, to be named “Forrest ‘Clink’ Miner ‘41”, will be dedicated on April 24, at 12:00 at the Donahue Rowing Center.

In a recent development, it was announced that in spring 2004 the boys' team will be taking delivery of a brand new Vespoli M2 Racing shell as a result of an act of personal generosity by Mrs. Babs Donahue. The
